

Pre-Convention: The Physical Education Curriculum Analysis Tool (PECAT)



The Physical
Education Curriculum
Analysis Tool (PECAT)
is a self-assessment and
planning guide developed
by CDC. It is designed to
help school districts and
schools conduct clear,

complete, and consistent analysis of physical education curricula, based upon national physical education standards. The results of the PECAT can be used by school districts to enhance existing physical education curricula, develop curricula, or select published curricula that will deliver high quality physical education to students. This workshop will provide an overview of the PECAT and strategies for using the PECAT as a part of the Kentucky Program Review.

Nov. 11th 4 pm - 8 pm. The workshop will
be presented by Aaron Beighle from the
University of Kentucky and will be available

First General Session Keynote: A Funny Thing Happened on My Way to School



Dr. Jim L. Stillwell received his doctorate in physical education from Indiana University in 1978. Since 1994 he has served as Professor and Chair of the Department of Health, Physical

Education and Sport Sciences at Arkansas State University in Jonesboro. He has written four books dealing with physical education curriculum from pre-K to high school. His most recent co-authored book is Preventing Childhood Obesity: Helping Preschool Children Become Healthy and Fit (2008). He has 50+ journal publications and more than 100 state, national, and international presentations dealing with physical activities for young children. Jim has been an invited speaker in Canada, China, England, Greece, Israel, Malaysia, and Thailand. He most recently attended KAHPERD last year (2011) where he presented a 2-hour session on Activities Your Kids are Going to Love. He will

again be presenting Rhythmic Activities Your Kids Are Gonna Love based on his popular elementary physical education activities at this year's convention in addition to his Keynote message. Jim is a long-time friend of KAHPERD and it is our privilege to have him bring his unique and energetic teaching methods to Kentucky.

#### Second General Session:



Robbie Valentine, former high school and University of Louisville standout basketball player, and current Assistant General Manager for KFC YUM! Center will be our second general

session speaker. Robbie knows what it takes to succeed. A scholarship athlete on the University of Louisville's 1986 NCAA championship basketball team, he graduated the following year with a master degree in education and served as a student assistant coach to Denny Crum. He was inducted into the University's Hall of Fame in 2000.

Robbie founded Robbie Valentine Enterprises in 1991 to help children through clinics and camps, motivational speeches, organizing charity basketball

games as well as the STARS Club Education Program. He has served the community on numerous boards, including: Dare to Care; Boys and Girls Clubs; University of Louisville Alumni Association; Juvenile Justice Crime Commission: Jeffersonville Human Relations Commission; Champions Against Drugs; DARE, and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, He was recognized for his devotion to charitable causes by having the street he grew up on renamed "Robbie Valentine Drive." In 2002, Jeffersonville Indiana gave Robbie their "Best and Brightest Award." A tireless worker. Robbie's speaking engagements number more than 450 a year, where he preaches the doctrine that hard work and education can take a student anywhere they want to go.

Robbie is currently the Assistant General Manager of KFC YUM! Center in Louisville, Kentucky. He served for seven years on the Greater Clark County School Board. He is recognized as an active member of the National Affiliation Program, which demonstrates significant commitment to raising student achievement and dedication to improving the quality of education for all students in every community.

Robbie supports and donates to several charities and causes. He has organized and raised over \$1,000,000 for local charities.

Sandra Sims is an associate professor at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. At UAB, she teaches undergraduate and graduate courses involving methods of teaching in physical education and coaching. She is also the Major's Club advisor.

Sandra has been a member of AAHPERD, SDAAHPERD and ASAHPERD since 1980. She loves to serve her professional organizations by working on committees or being a member on the Board of Directors. For AAHPERD, she has served as the Chair of the Public Affairs and Legislative Committee and Chair of NASPE Public Policy committee. For Southern District, Sandra is currently serving as President-Elect. She has served Southern District as Vice President of General Division, Vice President of Recreation, Secondary Physical Education Council Chair, Therapeutic Recreation Council Chair and Advocacy Committee Chair. She has also served as a member on the following committees: Constitutions and By-Laws Committee, District, Alliance and State Relations Committee, Nominating Committee,

Recreation Professional of the Year Committee, Advocacy Ad Hoc Committee, and General Arrangement Branch Director for the 2001 SDAAHPERD Convention.

In Alabama, she has served ASAHPERD as President, Vice President of Physical Education and General Divisions, as secretary and as Chair of the Research Council. Sandra is currently serving as the ASAHPERD Director of the Advocacy, the position she has held for almost 20 years.

Sandra has published sixteen refereed national journal articles, seven refereed state level journal articles, four refereed nationally published professional documents and one reviewed state level governmental document. She has served as an editor/reviewer nationally for NASPE and PE Central and also for the ASAHPERD Journal.

Sandra has been an invited speaker sixty eight times, including 7 national, 40 regional and 21 state presentations. She has also attended professional conferences where she has made sixty nine refereed presentations (2 international, 12 national, 19 regional and 36 state level). In all, Sandra has made 137 invited and refereed presentations.

Sandra has been awarded SDAAHPERD Honor Award, SDAAHPERD Secondary School Physical Education Teacher of the Year, SDAAHPERD Middle School Physical Education Teacher of the Year, ASAHPERD Honor Award, ASAHPERD Secondary School Physical Education Teacher of the Year, ASAHPERD Middle School Physical Education Teacher of the Year and ASAHPERD Female Coach of the Year. She was also Teacher of the Year for Jemison High School, Chilton County Teacher of the Year and Alabama District 3 Teacher of the Year. UAB honored Sandra in 2012 with the Excellence in Service to Students Award from the National Society of Leadership and Success.

Hello KAHPERD friends. I hope this message finds you well and the new semester has started without a hitch. This second term of Presidency with KAHPERD has been very special for me. I can't begin

No votes (other than the election for President) were taken as a result of that cancelled meeting, but I encourage you to follow the KAHPERD webpage for updates on AAHPERD unification activities.

It is time to think about the annual KAHPERD convention! The KAHPERD board has been

busy the past few months putting together a wonderful slate of sessions and activities. This year's convention will be held at the Galt House in Louisville on November 11-13th. It has been a few years since we last met at the Galt House. Since then, the Galt House has made significant improvements and is eager to host us again. Although many things around us have increased in price, the room rates at the Galt House remain at the same rate as our convention last year. To take advantage of this rate, be sure to book your room soon. On Sunday we have a special 4-hour professional development session on the PECAT sponsored by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and presented by Dr. Aaron Beighle. This is a wonderful opportunity for teachers to gain skills that will transfer to the Program Review. This pre-convention workshop is free to KAHPERD members only. Be among the first 150 to register in order to attend. I am also excited to announce that Dr. Jim Stillwell from Arkansas State University-Jonesboro will be our first General session speaker. 


